

Award: Outstanding Collaborative Working - Charities

Open to: All Lifetime Lawyers working collaboratively with a local, regional, or national charity
(As this is a collaborative working award - both winners will receive a trophy)

This Lifetime Lawyer and charity collaboration has genuinely had a positive impact on the lives of older and vulnerable people. They are both dedicated to delivering meaningful and measurable change. The development of this strong collaborative working relationship has made a tangible difference and helped to advance the mission of the charity.

Requirements

Your submission will need to consist of 3 main parts:

Part 1 – Your covering statement (a maximum of 150 words)

This should state why you should win this award.

Part 2 – Your full submission (a maximum of 1000 words)

You will need to cover the following:

Your submission must tell the story about why you should win the *Outstanding Collaborative Working - Charities* and must also cover the specific criteria below:

1. Talk about how you both work collaboratively and how it helped to advance the charity's mission
2. Talk about your aims for the future of collaborative working and how you both hope to achieve them
3. Talk about how you developed a culture of collaborative working and what benefits it brings to both organisations
4. Give an example of how a piece of collaborative working has had a positive impact on the lives of older and vulnerable people

Please provide one piece of supporting evidence in an appendix to your submission, clearly stating to which of the four points above your evidence relates.

Part 3 – Your Pearl of Wisdom (a sentence or short paragraph)

What one piece of advice would you share with the audience to help them in their work? This could be a technical insight, a tip, an observation, something that works well for you, or advice shared with you that has stuck with you.

NB: The best pearls of wisdom may be shared with the audience as we would like to give audience members something really useful to take away from the Twilight Awards.
